- PREVENT: Part of the **PREVENT Governments** Counter Terrorism Strategy to stop people being drawn into extremism **SPOC:** Single Point of Contact (PREVENT) responsible for preventing children being impacted by radicalisation.
- LADO: Local Authority Designated Officer who deals with position of trust safeguarding issues
- DBS: Disclosure & Barring DBS Service used to make safe recruitment decision
- CEOP: Child Exploitation and Online Protection centre
- Early Help: providing Early Help support as soon as a problem emerges, at any point in a child's life.

The Role of the Designated Safeguarding Lead at Heath Primary

At Heath Primary School, the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) plays a crucial role in taking lead responsibility for child protection issues within the school. Our DSL team is composed of senior members of the school's leadership team to ensure a high level of expertise and authority in safeguarding matters. The team includes:

Mr. Lynch – the senior DSL

Mrs. Hill – the deputy DSL

Mrs. Brough, Mrs. Wild, and Mrs. McCubbin - additional members of our safeguarding DSL team

A DSL is always available during school hours for staff to discuss any safeguarding concerns they have. Additionally, DSLs are always contactable for our parents and carers. If you need to speak to a member of the safeguarding team, please visit the school office and ask for assistance.

DSLs are trained specifically for this role, with their training being updated every two years. They also participate in additional training and conferences to stay informed

about best practices and legal requirements.

Key Responsibilities of a DSL:

Support: Collaborating with staff, parents, and external agencies

Guidance: Providing advice and training to staff

Referrals: Managing and directing safeguarding concerns to appropriate services

Records: Keeping accurate and secure records of safeguarding issues

Our dedicated DSL team ensures that the safety and well-being of every child at Heath Primary School is a top priority.

How can we support at school?

Mrs. Hill (Assistant Head) and Mrs. McCubbin (Family Liaison Worker) are here to support all our children and families.

Mrs. Hill assists with Child Protection/Child in Need plans, Early Help Assessments, legalities, and connects you with external agencies

Mrs. McCubbin is DSL and ELSA trained, working across the school to support children's social and emotional needs, whether in group or individual sessions tailored to each child's requirements.

And remember, they both will offer a helping hand, a listening ear, and nonjudgmental advice. They are always available for a chat over a cup of tea or coffee if you have any worries or concerns!

Our Wonderful Nurture Provision

We're lucky to have Mrs. May and Mrs. Wileman running our Nurture Provision. It offers a safe, supportive space with routines to foster social, emotional, and behavioural growth.
